	Competitors, Umpires	 Ball handling (games only): Each team must bring / be provided with two game balls for use during defensive innings. Ideally, they should be new and unopened. Slowpitch softball only (outdoor): these should be two 11" and two 12" balls, with a nominated defensive team player (offensive if short) responsible for changing them over and sanitising them before returning into play.
